NOTES

Songs For Two Men (who shouldn't be singing together) is a cycle of five songs written for two baritone singers. Several musical styles are used, and the texts represent men who are often cast as opposites.

Realities sets the stage. **Dreams** comments on the passing of time from the perspectives of young and old. A bride's father and her fiancé worry out loud in **Judgments**. In **Prayers**, a Jewish cantor and a Catholic celebrant offer their versions of Psalm 96: 1 – 3. (*Sing to the Lord a new song; let the whole earth sing! Sing to the Lord and bless His name; forever proclaim His power to save. Publish His glory among the heathen, His wonderful acts for all to hear.*) **Sayings** consists entirely of familiar maxims, set as a conversation between two men who will never see eye to eye.

NOTES

Sun and Moon -- Caught in the drama of war, an American soldier and a Vietnamese woman sing of their love for one another.

Bist du bei mir -- (translation) If you are with me, then I will go gladly unto death and to my rest. Ah, how pleasing were my end, if your dear hands then shut my faithful eyes!

Widmung -- (trans.) Oh do not thank me for these songs. I thank you; You give them to me, I give back again what was and always will be yours. They are all yours. I, the light of your dear eyes, have read them faithfully. Do you recognize your own songs?

Cara e dolce -- (trans.) Dear and sweet freedom, you console my soul. It no longer lives in servitude if my heart, set loose, goes its way.

Non lo diro col labbro -- (trans.) I'll not say it with my lips that haven't courage; perhaps the spark of my burning eyes, revealing my love, my glance will speak.

Bring Him Home -- Jean Valjean prays that God will save young Marius.

Widmung -- (trans.) You my soul, my heart, my rapture, oh you my pain, my world in which I live, my heaven to which I aspire, oh you my grave, into which my grief forever I've consigned! You are repose, are peace, are bestowed on me from heaven. Your love for me gives me my worth, your eyes transfigure me. You raise me lovingly above myself, my guardian angel, my better self!

Lydia -- (trans.) Lydia, on your rosy cheeks, and on your neck, so fresh and white, flow sparkingly the fluid golden tresses which you loosen. This shining day is the best of all; let us forget the eternal grave, let your kisses, your kisses of a dove, sing on your blossoming lips. A hidden lily spreads forever a divine fragrance on your breast; numberless delights emanate from you, young goddess. I love you and die; kisses have carried away my soul! Oh Lydia, give me back life, that I may die, forever die!

Plastic d'amour -- (trans.) Love's pleasure lasts only a moment; its grief lasts a lifetime. I gave up all for ungrateful Sylvia, she leaves me for another. "As long as this water runs gently toward the brook that borders the meadow, I will love you," Sylvia told me. The water still runs, but she has changed.

In My Dreams -- What if your dreams the only clue to who you really are?

Nina -- (trans.) For three long days my Nina, upon her bed has lain. Louder, ye players, awaken my little Nina that she may sleep no more.

Questo a quella -- The Duke of Mantua sings proudly.

(trans.) This girl or that girl are equal to all the others I see, my heart I will not yield to one beauty or another. Their beauty is what fate gives them and embellishes life. Perhaps today this girl welcomes me, perhaps tomorrow another will demand me. Constancy is a tyrant to the heart; it is a hated cruel

disease to those who want you to be faithful. There can be no love if there is no freedom. Husbands' jealous rage, lovers' woes I despise, I defy the hundred eyes of Argo if I fancy a few beauties!

L'Heure exquise – (trans.) The white moon shines in the woods. From each branch springs a voice beneath the arbor: "Oh my beloved." Like a deep mirror the pond reflects the silhouette of the black willow where the wind weeps. Let us dream! It is the hour. A vast and tender calm seems to descend from a sky made iridescent by the moon. It is the exquisite hour!

Bois épais – (trans.) Deep woods, increase your shade; you could not be dark enough to conceal my unhappy love. I feel a despair whose horror is extreme. I am to see no longer what I love, I want no longer to bear the light of day.

The Lord is my Shepherd -- A poetic rendition of the 23rd psalm.

Before returning to the Midwest, he was a member of the music faculty at Point Loma Nazarene University in San Diego for 24 years. Born in upstate New York, Dr. Kenyon has studied at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto, and earned the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Michigan State University. He has recorded three CDs of solo piano music — “Garden Music,” “Chiaroscuro” and “Delight, Touch, and Inspire” and appears frequently with a variety of chamber music and jazz ensembles. Recent performances have included concert appearances with violinist, Päivikki Nykter; string bassist and author, Barry Green; and the Catalina Trio.

PROGRAM NOTES

Douze Études are highly sought-after Snare Etudes in the Percussion community, composed by Jacques Delécluse. These Etudes are advanced snare drum literature that are used in Professional Auditions and show mastery of the snare drum. Études #3 is a great complex piece that has an A B A Format that has metric modulation to show the complexity in how the piece flows between the Form. The quick dynamic changes between Forte and Piano with complex rhythms is what makes this Étude a great example of mastery on snare drum. The aspect that the piece has a huge metric modulation that starts with Triplets and ends with Sixtuplets is a hard passage that shows the Form transition of B- A.

Serenade and Rondo, composed by James Corigliano, was written for and premiered at a benefit concert performed by the composer. The piece is intended to take advantage of the melodic capabilities of the alto saxophone and is coupled with a piano part which is an interplay with the saxophone rather than an accompaniment.

Douze Études this is a continuation of etudes composed by Jacques Delécluse. Etude 4 is the first of the twelve etudes that uses multiple meters but is similar in form to the previous. The opening eight measures phrase will be considered the A section. The B section encompasses mm. 9–26 and introduces new material to the etude as well as further developing the syncopated triplet motive presented in m. 4. Another theme that is apparent throughout is the relationship between sixteenth note triplet and thirty-second note groupings.

Chanson de Printemps, Op. 62, No. 6 is one of the most famous of Songs Without Words (German Lieder ohne Worte) composed by German composer, Felix Mendelssohn. Song No. 6 "Spring Song" was sometimes known in England as "Camberwell Green", being the place in London where Mendelssohn composed it. This is a transcription and adaptation by Marcel Mule for Alto Saxophone in Eb and Piano.

Neapolitan Tarantella, was composed by Alfred P. Zambarano. A tarantella, by definition, is a group of various folk dances characterized by a fast upbeat tempo, usually in 6/8 time. It is among the most recognized forms of traditional southern Italian music. This piece consists of an Andante introduction followed by an Allegro section in ABA form.

Romance de Amor arranged for Marimba by Ralph Hicks. Originally written for guitar, the composer of this piece is unknown. This piece is also known by other titles such as Estudio en Mi de Rubira and Romance de Espana. The original composer was believed to have composed this piece in the 19th century. There are many interpretations by well-known artists including Antonio Rubira, Narciso Yepes, and Xue Fei Yang. Common to most parlour music of 19th Century Spain. *Romance de Amor* is written in traditional A-B-

A ternary form (beginning in a minor key, venturing into its parallel major, then returning to the original minor). It became customary for artists to incorporate their own cadenza, allowing the performer to develop his or her own signature style and for each performance to be truly unique.

Holy, Holy, Holy, arranged by Joel Raney for Piano 4-Hands, is a setting of a timeless hymn of praise that portrays the power and majesty of the triune God. A variety of musical forces combine to capture the heart and soul of this great and mighty hymn. “Holy, holy, holy! Lord, God Almighty. All Thy works shall praise Thy name in earth and sky and sea. Holy, holy, holy! Merciful and mighty. God in three persons, blessed Trinity”

Overture to Timpani Composed by Kirk J. Gay is an unaccompanied 5 Drum Timpani solo with an advanced Grade level of 5. This piece is currently on the Group 1 solo list for the Florida Bandmasters Association and is regularly played for a senior recital in a master's degree setting for college requirements. *Overture for Timpani* is an exciting recital piece to showcase the technique and musicianship of the timpanist. With a dramatic and lyrical opening, the overture bursts into its main "allegro" theme which leads to melodic, energetic, and technical phrases requiring various pedaling and cross-over stickings.

Orphée, Scene Des Champs-Élysés, composed by Christoph Willibald Gluck is taken from the Champs-Élysées Scene (Acte II) in the Opera 'Orpheus And Eurydice'. It is divided into two main parts: Lento Dolcissimo and Più Lento, which are both repeated with the piece finishing on a Coda. This is a transcription and adaptation by Marcel Mule for Alto Saxophone in Eb and Piano.

In the Garden/What A Friend We Have In Jesus, arranged by Brant Adams, is included in his third volume of hymn arrangements for the advanced player.

In the Garden

Catching Shadows written by Ivan Trevino is a marimba duo commissioned by Michael Burrit, professor of percussion at Eastman School of Music in Rochester, NY. The piece was premiered by Michael and Ivan at the 2013 Rochester Fringe Festival. Ivan Trevino was inspired to write *Catching Shadows* because of a Road Trip that Ivan and Michael had where Michael was in control of the music selection. This is where Ivan found out that Michael was a Rock Musician as well as a Classical Musician.

I am excited and extremely blessed to be performing *Catching Shadows* on my Junior Recital tonight. I have had a lot of difficulties this past year after breaking my right hand in an accident. At that time, I was to perform on my best friend, John Donovan's, Senior Recital Hearing, which we were performing *Catching Shadows Percussion Sextet*. I was able to play it with him that day and thankfully he passed, but was unable to play with him for his recital. After facing many doctor appointments, physical therapy, and psychological hardships, I was told that my odds of ever playing music again were very low. Over the course of the year, I have been able to relearn myself how to play many percussion instruments with a change of technique or feel, from how I had been trained for over 10 years. So, I am excited to be performing *Catching Shadows Duo* with John Donovan, 1 year after my accident.

Brazileira is the third movement of the suite, **Scaramouche**, composed by Darius Milhaud. It is a mix of Brazilian and French street music that was originally intended for two pianos. Brazileira is written in the form of a samba, a typical musical form performed at Carnival celebrations in Brazil. It is in a duple meter, with a dance-like beat, lots of syncopation and lively inflections. The interlocking piano and saxophone parts tie so well together that it makes this piece as fast as it is popular.

Mr. Snow presents this recital in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the Bachelor of Music degree in Music Performance with emphasis in percussion. He is the student of Dr. Matt Jacklin.

Miss Wierenga presents this recital in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the Bachelor of Music degree in Music Education and Music Performance with emphasis in saxophone. She is the student of Prof. Jerry Luzeniecki.

Program Notes

Clifton Williams (1923-1976) was an American pianist, conductor and teacher as well as a composer. As a French hornist, he performed with the symphony orchestras of Baton Rouge, New Orleans, Houston, Oklahoma City, Austin and San Antonio. He was a World War II veteran, serving in the U.S. Army Air Force. After earning degrees from Louisiana State University and the Eastman School of Music, he joined the faculty of University of Texas and, later, was appointed as the Chair of the Theory and Composition Department at the University of Miami. **Variation Overture** was dedicated to the American School Band Directors' Association and was premiered at their convention in Cleveland, OH in December 1961.

Blessed Are They by Johannes Brahms (1833-1897) is the first movement of the *German Requiem*. It was premiered in the Bremen Cathedral on Good Friday, 1868. Barbara Buehlman was the Band Director for the Round Lake, IL Schools from 1960 until 1983 when she left that position to become the full-time administrator for the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic, an important annual event in Chicago that takes place in December. She served in that position until 1997.

According to Sousa biographer, Paul E. Bierley, John Philip Sousa composed **Fairest of the Fair** for the annual exposition and music jubilee held by the Boston Grocers' Association in 1908. In previous years, Sousa was impressed by a charming young lady "who was the center of attention of the displays in which she was employed." He wrote this march after receiving the invitation to perform at the engagement and, remembering that young lady, gave it its title.

Composers program note for **Fanfare and Flourishes**: "Based on Marc-Antoine Charpentier's (1634-1704) *Te Deum*, "Fanfare and Flourishes for a Festive Occasion" was commissioned for the 1991 European Brass Band Championships held in Rotterdam, Holland. The premiere performance was given by the Black Dyke Mills Brass Band during the Gala Concert. The symphonic band version was commissioned by the Alfred M. Barbe High School Symphonic Band, Lake Charles, Louisiana, Steve Hand, Conductor.

Variations on a Korean Folk Song is a major musical work written for concert band in 1965. As the name implies, *Variations* consists of a set of variations on the Korean Folk Song, "Arirang" (My Beloved One), which the composer heard while in South Korea with the U.S. Army in the late 1950's. In 1966, the piece was awarded the American Bandmasters Association's *Ostwald Award*.

Frank Ticheli is an American composer of orchestra, choral, chamber, and concert band works. He lives in Los Angeles, California, where he is a Professor of Composition at the University of Southern California. His setting of the spiritual, **Amazing Grace**, has become a classic for the Concert Band. The work was commissioned by John Whitwell in loving memory of his father, John Harvey Whitwell. It was first performed on February 10, 1994 by the Michigan State University Wind Symphony, John Whitwell conductor.”

Robert Jager is an American composer, music theorist, and a conductor. His works are played throughout the world by various orchestras, bands, choruses, and chamber ensembles. **Esprit de Corps** is the second Robert Jager work commissioned by the United States Marine Band. The composer intends that this work should display the fervor and virtuosity of the Marine Band and the musical spirit and integrity of their conductor, Colonel John R. Bourgeois.

An organist, Paul Creston b1906 – d1985, was largely self-taught as a composer. He became a tenured music professor with the New York School of Music. John Corigliano and Elliot Schwartz were among his pupils. At the request of Edwin Franko Goldman, he composed **Celebration Overture** for the American Bandmasters Association. The work is in three continuous sections. The composition explores extended harmonies, and sequential melodic and rhythmic development.

Jan Van der Roost b1956, is a Belgian composer and professor at the Lemmensinstituut. He has composed large catalog over 90 works, largely for brass band and wind band. **Canterbury Chorale** was inspired by a visit to an old cathedral. The simple melody is treated in strophe over rich harmonies that explore the full tonal colors of the wind ensemble.

A graduate of Eastman, Dana Wilson b1946, is on the composition faculty at the Ithaca College School of Music. His compositions have earned him many awards including the Sudler Award and the Oswalt Prize. The composer writes, **Shortcut Home** is a rousing, rather elaborate fanfare that features each section of the ensemble. Drawing upon various jazz styles, the music proclaims and cascades, always driving towards the "home" of the final, C Major chord.

John Philip Sousa b1854 – d1932, write 136 marches and was undoubtedly the most well-known American band conductor and composer of his day.

After the Spanish War there was some feeling in Europe anent our republic regarding this war. Some of the nations...thought we were not justified while others gave us credit for the honesty of our purpose. One night I was reading

an old play and I came across this line, A sudden thought strikes me...Let us swear an eternal friendship." This almost immediately suggested the title **Hands across the Sea** for that composition and within a few weeks that now famous march became a living fact.

Program Notes

To Journey Home is inspired by the use of strong melodies and driving rhythms in “Gusty Garden Galaxy” by Mahito Yokota. My piece follows the Sonata form, with a statement of the theme, development of the theme and recapitulation. The piece is intended to depict the journey of a young man exploring the world in his youth and realizing the importance of home.

Pure was inspired by my longing for the mountains. In the high altitude, the air becomes thin, but it also becomes crisp. Even in winter, when the air cools down to subzero temperatures it becomes crisp, it becomes pure.

Potentia is the first brass piece I've written, so I learned a lot from it! I was inspired to write this piece by using the Tonnetz, which is used as a visual representation of traditional harmonic relationships. As I wrote it, I liked to think about some knight or hero because of its fanfare-ish qualities.

Inlustris — meaning starlight — was writing for the wedding of Monty and Hannah Larcom. Beginning with a solo line in E harmonic minor, it then unfolds to an arpeggiation pattern that accompanies a simple melody that eventually shifts into E major. Mixed meters — switching between 6/8 and 9/8, for example — are a main feature of this composition.

Piano waltzes have always held a certain aesthetic appeal for me as both a performer and composer. This **Waltz in E-Flat** is only one of several waltzes I have written and intend to write more in the future. At their most fundamental level, I see them as a basic form to which I can always turn back for peace and familiarity, while also finding myself inspired to experiment with new musical ideas and complexities. In much the same way, “Waltz in E-Flat” expresses my love for the art of the waltz by starting the theme simply, then growing to explore bolder sounds and more colorful phrasings, before coming around to resolve with the same simplicity as its origination.

Lent - I began writing this piece in January of 2020. It started as a small sketch and then it kept developing into something bigger than I originally planned. This was my quarantine project and I'm very proud of how it turned out! I decided early on that I wanted to develop it into my first symphony, but it didn't seem to fit what I wanted as an opener. So I decided that it would be better as a second movement. There are many dramatic and sweeping moments in this piece that will certainly pull on your heart strings. I hope you enjoy!

So, with this "tone poem" that I have composed, this is my interpretation and love for this painting. Godspeed.

Fleeting Moments was inspired by my thoughts about how quickly time passes. Reflecting on good and bad experiences in our lives can help us realize how far we have come in our life's journey.

Interstate Flying - This song was written as a fun interpretation of the airport outside my hometown. It's just a fun little tune.

Program Notes

Concerto pour trompette et orchestre en ré majeur - composed by Leopold Mozart, this concerto was completed in 1762 and includes two movements. Only the first movement contains a cadenza which has sometimes been adapted or completely changed by performers at their discretion.

Axel Jørgensen was a violinist for The Danish Royal Orchestra. It was there that Jørgensen met Anton Hansen, the orchestra's solo trombonist, for whom it is believed Jørgensen composed this work. **Romance** for Trombone and Piano was originally premiered in Copenhagen by Anton Hansen with orchestral accompaniment. It was well received upon its premiere, likely due to the beautiful lyricism in both the solo and piano voices. The piece is a tonal work, characterized by dramatic dynamic swells and an almost entirely rubato style.

The Debutante (Caprice Brilliant) was a cornet solo composed in 1912 and is known as one of the most famous pieces written by Herbert L. Clarke. The Debutante features two different cadenzas throughout the duration of the piece.

Vocalise #5 - Marco Bordogni's vocalises were, as the name suggests, written as unaccompanied vocal pieces. In 1928 they were arranged by Joannès Rochut, then principal trombonist of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. In 1992, trombonist Tom Irvin wrote complementary parts to Rochut's arrangements, turning them into charming and lyrical duets.

Composed by Leroy Anderson in 1949, **A Trumpeter's Lullaby** is a short piece written for solo trumpet accompanied by an orchestra. This piece was composed at the request of Roger Voisin, principal trumpet player of the Boston Pops Orchestra around the same time. A short statement from the composer highlights this request, stating "Suddenly Roger Voisin asked me why I didn't write a trumpet solo for him to play with the orchestra that would be different from traditional trumpet solos which are all loud, martial or triumphant. After thinking it over, it occurred to me that I had never heard a lullaby for trumpet so I set out to write one — with a quiet melody

based on bugle notes played by the trumpet and with the rest of the orchestra playing a lullaby background.”

Concerto - Launy Grondahl composed this piece in 1924, and dedicated it to his friend Wilhelm Aarkrog, trombonist with the Royal Orchestra of Copenhagen. Each Movement of the concerto alternates between two contrasting themes. The first movement sets the dramatic and majestic style that is prevalent throughout the piece. The second movement is believed to have been written as a funeral march, mourning the loss of a loved one. The third movement alternates between a rapid rhythmic motif and a freer more lyrical passage. The concerto is one of the most played and beloved pieces in the trombone repertoire.

Encore Piece is a short piece for solo trumpet composed by Wilke Renwick in 1974. It was written to be used as an encore piece after the end of a performance.

22 Cathedral Duets for 2 B^b Trumpets is a trumpet duet piece composed by Michel Rondeau in the late 20th century. The piece was performed previously by another trumpet player in both the Church of the Gesù and the Ottawa Notre-Dame Cathedral Basilica. The piece features 22 separate movements, five of them being performed on this recital.

The Pink Panther was composed by Henry Mancini as the theme for the 1963 film *The Pink Panther* and was nominated for the Academy Award for Best Original Score at the 37th Academy Awards. In his autobiography *Did They Mention the Music?* Mancini talked about how he composed the theme music, “I told [the animators] that I would give them a tempo they could animate to, so that any time there were striking motions, someone getting hit, I could score to it. [The animators] finished the sequence and I looked at it. All the accents in the music were timed to actions on the screen.”

NOTES

L'Heure exquisite: The white moon gleams in the woods; from every branch there comes a voice beneath the boughs. . . O my beloved. The pool reflects, deep mirror, the the black willow's silhouette where the wind is weeping. . . let us dream, it is the hour. A vast and tender consolation seems to fall from the sky which the moon illumines. . . exquisite hour!

Chanson d'Amour: I love your eyes, I love your brow, O my rebel, O my wild one, I love your eyes, I love your mouth where my kisses shall dissolve. I love your voice, I love the strange charm of all you say, O my rebel, O my dear angel, my inferno and my paradise. I love all that makes you beautiful from your feet to your hair, O you the object of all my vows, O my wild one, O my rebel.

Nuit d'Toiles: Night of stars, beneath your veils, beneath your breeze and fragrance, sad lyre that sighs, I dream of bygone loves. Serene melancholy now blooms deep in my heart, and I hear the soul of my love quiver in the dreaming woods. Once more at our fountain I see your eyes, blue as the sky; this rose is your breath, these stars your eyes.

Is it Really Me? Lizzie is a plain girl who feels she has no chance of finding love, until Starbuck shows up and makes her see herself differently.

As if We Never Said Goodbye: Silent film star Norma Desmond returns to her old film studio, but she believes she is still the young star that she once was.

Mini Cabs: The title of this set refers to mini-cabaret songs. These are short pithy thoughts set to music, all with different themes.

By Strauss:

Johann Strauss was an Austrian composer famous for his waltzes and dance music. Gershwin uses satire to poke fun at himself and his contemporaries. This was also used in a few movies, including *An American in Paris*.

Meine Lieder: When my heart begins to make music and the vibrating loosens wondrous tones, there hover before me, here and there, pale ecstasies, unforgotten, and the shadows of the cypresses; dark is the sound of my songs!

Seit ich ihn gesehen: Since first seeing him, I think I am blind, wherever I look, him only I see; As in a waking dream his image hovers before me, rising out of deepest darkness ever more brightly. All else is dark and pale around me, my sisters' games I no more long to share, I would rather weep quietly in my room.

Er, der Herrlichste von allen: He, the most wonderful of all, how gentle and loving he is! Sweet lips, bright eyes, a clear mind and firm resolve. Just as there in the deep-blue distance that star gleams bright and brilliant, so does he shine in my sky, bright and brilliant, distant and sublime. Wander, wander on your way, just to gaze on your radiance, just to gaze on in humility, to be but blissful and sad! Do not heed my silent prayer, uttered for your happiness alone, you shall never know me, lowly as I am, you noble star of splendour! Only the worthiest woman of all may be your choice, and I shall bless that exalted one many thousands of times. Then shall I rejoice and weep, blissful shall I be, even if my heart should break, O heart, what does it matter?

Ich kann's nicht fassen, nicht glauben: I cannot grasp it, believe it, a dream has beguiled me; how, from all women, could he have exalted and favored me? He said, 'I am yours forever'; I was, I thought, still dreaming, after all, it can never be. O let me, dreaming, die, cradled on his breast; let me savor blissful death in tears of endless joy.

Du Ring an meinem finger: You ring on my finger, my golden little ring, I press you devoutly to my lips, to my heart. I had finished dreaming childhood's peaceful dream, I found myself alone, forlorn in boundless desolation. You ring on my finger, you first

taught me, opened my eyes to life's deep eternal worth. I shall serve him, live for him, belong to him wholly, yield to him and find myself transfigured in his light.

Non so più cosa son: I do not know anymore what I am, what I do; one moment I'm on fire, the next moment cold as ice, every woman changes my color, makes me tremble. At the very mention of love, of delight, I am greatly troubled, my heart stirs within my chest, it compels me to speak of love a desire I can not explain. I speak of love while I'm awake, I speak of love while I'm dreaming, water, shade, mountains, flowers, grass, fountains, echo, air, and the winds, the sound of my hopeless words are taken away with them. And if I do not have anyone near to hear me I speak of love to myself!

Che farò senza Euridice: What will I do without Euridice? Where will I go without my wonderful one. Euridice, oh God, answer, I am entirely your loyal one. Euridice! Ah, it doesn't give me any help, any hope, neither this world nor heaven.

Smánie implacabili: Ah, move away! Fear the sad effect of a desperate affection! Shut those windows, I hate the light, hate the air I breathe. I hate myself! Who mocks my pain, who consoles me? Oh, leave me alone. Implacable restlessness, that disturbs me inside this soul, doesn't cease, until it makes me die. A miserable example of fateful love I will give to the furies, if I live, with the horrible sound of my sighs.

Program Notes

Fantasia and Rondo – The Rondo movement of this piece was one that I worked on during the lock-down, and I played with a recorded piano accompaniment, so I am grateful to Prof. Ring this time around! I am also

This is no substitute for making music with other people, so I am so thankful for the friends who gave up their time to help me with this. Double Concerto – Nolan and I had the idea to play a duet and thought it would be simple to put it together because both of our instruments are in the same key. Sweeter Using the text from Leila N. Morris's gospel song *Sweeter As the Years Go By*, this piece paints a picture with jazz.

The Father's Hand This piece depicts the Father reaching down to his children, through the use of foundational harmonies and a chant-like feel.

Resigned Anticipation This was written for ONU's production of *Two Rooms* by Lee Blessing. Lainie longs for her husband Michael's return. Stricken with grief, she alters her life and surroundings to feel close to him. To capture such loss and longing, this piece examines the singing melancholy of sorrow.

Wandering Journey Dorian is one of my favorite modes to use in music, giving the piece a medieval feeling. It sets up the picture of the Troubadour going from village to village in devotion to his art, a "wandering journey."

Glassy Sea, Midnight Dreams

This piece can be challenging to play rhythmically due to complex phrasing that depicts the ebb and flow of a rolling sea. The flute adds crispness of tone for the glimmering water. Nonfunctioning harmonies add the distinct quality of night with no relation to land.

Per questa bella mano (translation)

For this beautiful hand, for these lovely eyes, I swear, my dear, that I shall love none but you. The breeze, the stones and trees that know well my sighs will tell you all you want that I am undyingly true. Give me happy or haughty looks, even tell me you hate or love me. Always, you may have ambrosial arrows, always, it is your voice above me. Neither earth nor heaven can dim the longing that lives within.

La Vendetta (translation)

Vengeance, oh vengeance is a pleasure for the wise. Forgetting shames and insults is a sign of lowness and cowardice. With cunning, with wit with wisdom, with common sense, it could be done. The issue is serious, but believe me, it will be done. Even if I had to turn all the codex, even if I had to read all the index, by using a misunderstanding, we will find a tangle. All Seville knows Bartolo! Figaro the rascal will be defeated!

Let's Go Pillage

Its title is ironic and not meant with vulgarity, rather when used in conjunction to the lively and upbeat music of a video game, it reveals a humorous quality.

Alien Landscape

Picture this: A landscape red with Martian dust. We are on another planet where creatures with sounds we don't normally hear roam about the land.

Erlkönig (translation)

Narrator: Who's riding so late through the night and wind? It is the father with his child; he cradles the boy safe in his arm, holding him tightly, keeping him warm.

Father: "Son, why are you hiding your face in such fear?"

Son: "Don't you see, father, the Erlking wearing crown and train?"

Father: "Son, my son, I see it for sure: The old willows appear so grey."

Erlking: "I love you, beautiful child; if you're not willing, I'll use force!"

Son: "Father, my father, he's clutching me now. Erlking is hurting me!"

Narrator: The father shudders; he's riding fast. He holds the groaning child, reaching home desperate and spent. In his arms, the child is dead.

Miss Kijowski presents this recital in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree in Music with emphasis in flute. She is the student of Dr. Stephanie Lupo.

Program Notes

Jacques Ibert was a French composer who most often composed in the neoclassical style. He studied at the Paris conservatory and won its prestigious music composition competition *Prix de Rome* in 1919. He worked as the director of the French Academy in Rome from 1937 to 1960, and he was also the director of the Paris Opera and the Opéra-Comique.

Flute Concerto was written for the well-known French flutist Marcel Moyse in 1932 and first performed in 1934. This concerto contains three densely textured and intricate movements which follow the fast- slow-fast pattern. The first movement has many rapid sixteenth notes, alternating between boisterous tongued passages and more lyrical slurred passages. The slower second movement paints colors with impressionistic harmonies.

David Loeb is an American composer from New York who studied composition at the Mannes College of Music and Yale University. He has taught at the former since 1964. Throughout much of his career, he has written for early instruments and Japanese instruments.

Loeb wrote **Six Preludes** while thinking of the piccolo as a repository for the various high pipes of the world. Each movement is named after a different instrument. The *ti* is a small flute from China that is used for art music. The *taegum* is a Korean instrument used in ceremonial court music. In Tibet, the bamboo *donglim* plays a role in folk music. The transverse *shinobue* is bamboo flute from Japan. It can be used in folk music and theatrical music. The *suling* is a large, end-blown instrument from Bali with a delicate tone. The *khene* is from Laos, and it has many pipes. It is a distant ancestor of the Western harmonica. This piece was awarded the National Flute Association Newly Published Music Award in 1983.

Johann Sebastian Bach was a German Baroque composer who was born into a musical family and had children who were composers. He composed music for churches throughout much of his life. His music was only known in a small region while he lived and was almost forgotten after he died. It was not until Felix Mendelssohn revived Bach's music in the nineteenth century that it was well known.

Flute Sonata in E Minor was most likely written in 1723. It was written for flute and basso continuo. In the Baroque era, basso continuo was a musical system in which bass notes were given, and the performer, typically a harpsichordist, improvised the rest of the accompaniment. This sonata contains four movements which follow the slow-fast-slow-fast pattern that is common for sonatas. The first movement is calming, filled with steady,

moving notes in both the the flute and piano parts. The second movement is faster, alternating between melodic lines and passages of sixteenth notes.

Robert Dick is an American composer from New York City. As a leader of the movement for contemporary flute music, he has experimented with the possible sonorities on the flute. He invented the Glissando Headjoint® which allows a flutist to easily bend pitch. Robert Dick teaches flute, composition, and improvisation at New York University and the City of New York Graduate Center. He was the recipient of the 2014 National Flute Association Lifetime Achievement Award.

Fish Are Jumping is a Chicago-style twelve-bar blues. It features many extended techniques which are modern techniques that allow flutists to create different sonorities on the flute. This piece contains slides that call for the flutist to slowly move fingers off the holes of the keys. Another featured extended technique is the use of multiphonics in which the flutist uses an alternate fingering to play two pitches at the same time. In the middle of the piece, the flutist must sing a pitch while blowing into the flute.

Eric Wyse and Dawn Rodgers are American musicians involved in church music. Rodgers is a songwriter who has written songs such as “Great is Your Faithfulness.” She often works with her husband, Wyse who is a songwriter, keyboardist, and producer. He has served as the Director of Music at St. Bartholomew’s Episcopal Church since 1993.

Rodgers began composing this modern hymn in 1989. She wrote the melody while Wyse was away on a trip. When he returned, the couple worked on the song together. It was during a church service in which this song was featured that Rodgers completed the last verse.

This trio arrangement of **Wonderful, Merciful Savior** was arranged by Ellen Jacobs who has arranged many hymns and praise songs for piano. Throughout our college careers, Ellen, Bethany, and I have played arrangements of songs together. It is a joy to perform one more arrangement before we graduate together.

Armando Anthony “Chick” Corea was an American pianist who released countless albums throughout his career and received more than 65 Grammy nominations. Although he was classically trained, he was at the forefront of jazz in his career, playing in Miles Davis’ band in the 60s and in his own bands, such as *Return to Forever* and the *Elektric Band*. He recently passed away in February 2021, leaving a legacy in the music community that will forever have an impact.

Spain was first released in Corea’s album *Light as a Feather*. His arrangement of it for a sextet and orchestra received a Grammy nomination. This standard opens with a slower adagio section before a fast samba section begins.

Program Notes

Fillmore wrote **The Man of the Hour** in honor of Charles Phelps Taft, half brother of former president William Howard Taft, after he had made a substantial contribution to a building project after it was determined that half of the funding was not available.

Dr. Johnnie Vinson is Emeritus Director of Bands and Professor of Music at Auburn University. **The Singing River** was commissioned by the Shoals Area Band Directors Association in honor of the 25th Anniversary of the Shoals Honor Band, an organization that showcases outstanding high school band students in communities in northwest Alabama. It was premiered 2011 in Muscle Shoals, Alabama. The Yuchi Tribe's name the Tennessee River was "Nunnuhsae" or "the river that sings."

The musical "**The Man of LaMancha**" was based on the Cervantes classic, "*Don Quixote*." This is a musical profile of the main character with the selections "*I, Don Quixote*," "*Dulcinea*" and "*The Impossible Dream*."

Americans We is another march by Henry Fillmore. At the top of the conductor's score appear the words "*To all of us*." So here's to all of us!

Written in 1953, **American Overture** was the first work of Joseph Willcox Jenkins written for band when he was 25 years old. It came about during his first military stint. As an arranger for the U.S. Army Field Band, he composed the piece for this group to match their instrumentation, which was usual in many ways. For instance: he included a part not just for string bass, but also for cello; there are three distinct baritone parts; the flutes divide into 3; the clarinets and trombones each divide into 4. But the stars of this piece are definitely the horns. They famously leap an octave in the first measure. Horn players everywhere still treasure (or loathe) that famous opening figure. The rest of *American Overture* is a high-energy expression of bold optimism that puts every section of the band in the spotlight.

The composer, David Holsinger, wrote this piece as a radical departure from his normal compositional style. The frantic tempos, the ebullient rhythms we associate with Holsinger are replaced with a restful, gentle, and reflective composition based on the 1876 Philip Bliss/Horatio Spafford hymn, *It is Well with My Soul*. Written to honor the retiring principal of Shady Grove Christian Academy, **On a Hymnsong of Philip Bliss** was presented as a gift from the SGCA Concert Band to Rev. Steve Edel in May of 1989.

British composer, Gustav Holst, wrote his **First Suite in Eb for Military Band, Op. 28, No. 1** in 1909 and later published it in 1921. It is considered one of the cornerstone masterworks in the concert band repertoire. At this time concert bands were generally Brass bands including brass and percussion instruments. The term Military band was intended to combine woodwinds with brass and percussion instruments. The work is in three movements entitled: Chaconne, Intermezzo, and March.

Short Ride in a Fast Machine is an orchestral fanfare by John Adams that evokes the excitement or terror of a late-night thrill ride in a sports car. The piece was written in 1986 as an opener for a summer festival given by the Pittsburgh Symphony and later arranged for band by Lawrence Odom and for this version by Richard Saucedo. Since that time, it has become one of Adams' most frequently performed compositions. It is a masterpiece of minimalism, a compositional approach that entails the twining of compact, repetitive rhythms and melodic motifs into an intricate web of musical texture.

Julius Fucik was a Czech composer and conductor of military bands. He became a prolific composer, with over 400 marches, polkas, and waltzes to his name. He is often referred to as the "Bohemian Sousa". His worldwide reputation rests primarily on two works: **Florentiner March**, popular throughout most of Europe, and *Entry of the Gladiators*, which is widely recognized, often under its other title *Thunder and Blazes*, as one of the most popular themes for circus clowns.

Program Notes

Nitro, an energy-charged three-minute fanfare for band, was commissioned by the Northshore Concert Band, Mallory Thompson, music director, in celebration of their 50th anniversary season, and received its premiere performance by them on April 9th, 2006.

Nitrogen is the most abundant component of the Earth's atmosphere (78 per cent by volume), and is present in the tissues of every living thing. It is the fifth most abundant element in the universe, created by the fusion deep within stars; it has recently been detected in interstellar space. The sheer prevalence of nitrogen in all of nature, and the infinite range of compounds it is part of — life-giving, energizing, healing, cleansing, explosive — all appealed to me, and served as the inspiration for my music.

The main musical idea for Nitro is a powerful, angular theme, first announced by the trombones and horns, and then imitated in the trumpets. Trumpet fanfare calls and a busy and relentless chattering in the woodwinds enhance the bright, festive mood.

The middle section is based on a woodwind theme that is partly fanfare-like, partly dance-like. This contrasting theme is built from intervals occurring in the natural overtone series (octave and twelfth), giving it an expansive, open-air quality. The main theme reappears, growing in power and density all the while, building to a thunderous conclusion. -Program note from the composer.

To Journey Home is inspired by the use of strong melodies and driving rhythms in "Gusty Garden Galaxy" by Mahito Yokota. The piece follows the Sonata form, with a statement of the theme, development of the theme and recapitulation. The piece is intended to depict the journey of a young man exploring the world in his youth and realizing the importance of home. -Program note by the composer.

The wind band catalog of Percy Grainger is filled with tuneful passages, harmonic twists, and vibrant rhythmic variety. Written in 1907 for strings as a gift for his mother, **Molly on the Shore** has become a standard within the wind band repertoire. The composer has the following to say about this piece.

"In setting Molly on the Shore I strove to imbue the accompanying parts that made up the harmonic texture with a melodic character not too unlike that of the underlying reel tune. Melody seems to me to provide music with initiative, whereas rhythm appears to me to exert an enslaving influence. For that reason, I have tried to avoid regular rhythmic domination in my music -- always excepting irregular rhythms, such as those of Gregorian chant, which seem to me to make for freedom. Equally with melody, I prize discordant harmony, because of the emotional and compassionate sway it exerts." - Program Note by Percy Aldridge Grainger

The first of two trumpet solos Smith wrote for Carl "Doc" Severinsen, **Fantasy for Trumpet** was commissioned by the Getzen company and was published in 1967. The work begins with a dramatic opening followed by an Allegro section.

Smith then weaves in the blues for the soloist to play a wonderful lyric melody at first, then followed by an opportunity to adlib with the chord progression.

From the time he was five years old, Dr. Barkey Bryant has always had a passion for music. Since earning his doctorate in jazz performance from the University of Illinois in 2017, his specialty in jazz and classical trumpet, jazz piano, and singing has kept him busy as an in-demand musician with small groups, big bands, and orchestras in the Central Illinois region. Besides teaching trumpet and piano students both at Olivet and privately, his talents have given him the opportunity to perform all over the Midwest and Southeastern regions with great musicians such as Doc Severinsen and Bobby Shew. Even though his life is sometimes very hectic, he thoroughly enjoys spending time with his wife and their three young children.

Summer Dances is a joyful work in three short movements celebrating my favourite season where people are happiest outdoors. Each movement is a celebration. The first movement Summer Day celebrates the open air, with a bold and arrogant melody in 10/8 time, whose rhythm dominates the movement. The next movement, Summer Night, could be described as a beach habanera led by a sensuous trumpet melody. The movement ends with an ambiguous harmonic build-up, which is resolved at the start of the finale Summer Party with a folk-like theme that is passed round the ensemble, building up to a riotous and festive ending. Summer Dances was commissioned by HAFABRA Music, Louis Martinus, in collaboration with Biblioservice Gelderland/Music department MUI, Arnhem, the Netherlands.

- Program Note by composer

British composer Eric Coates wrote his three movement “London Suite” for orchestra in 1933. The work’s popularity led the composer to write a sequel which he titled, “London Again Suite.” It is the latter work which includes **Oxford Street March** as its opening movement. In the West End of London, Oxford Street is known for its shopping with nearly 500,000 per day visiting the thoroughfare for its estimated 300 shops. The march depicts the bustling activity of Oxford Street.
